

# OCSEA's BACHELOR'S DEGREE IS FREE FOR ALL - FOR A LIMITED TIME!

OCSEA's TOTALLY FREE bachelor's degree program with Central State University has been extended for non-UET eligible members and all family members of dues-paying members through Oct. 12 enrollment! **This is a limited time offer! Eligible applicants who enroll in any of the three CSU Fall Sessions will pay ZERO dollars out-of-pocket for a bachelor's degree in business administration, teacher education or criminal justice.**

The Fall Session start dates are as follows:

*Fall 1 - Aug. 17; Fall 2 - Sept. 8; & Fall 3 - Oct. 12.*

Enrollees will be able to complete their Fall and subsequent terms toward their bachelor's degree, with no cost, as long as they stay continuously enrolled.

A year ago, OCSEA partnered with Central State University near Dayton to bring members and their families this amazing post-secondary opportunity. The online bachelor's degree, which is always available TOTALLY FREE for UET-eligible OCSEA members, is now available FOR FREE to non-UET eligible members and OCSEA family members through Oct. 12 enrollment at the special no-cost price. Once this limited time offer is gone, non-UET eligible members and OCSEA family members will continue to be eligible for the program at an extremely reduced rate (No more than \$4,000 per year, and often less).

### Eligibility

OCSEA members in good standing (including retirees), their children, grandchildren, spouses and domestic partners are all eligible to receive the OCSEA Student Success Grant that keeps the cost either free or low. Family members do NOT need to be financial dependents or living with the member to be eligible. An associate degree or 60 credit hours is required to enroll.

# OCSEA Enrollment Checklist for CSU

1. Begin the process of applying to Central State University (CSU) by going to **OCSEAEducation.org/CSU** and filling out the interest form.
2. Apply online to Central State University at **OCSEAEducation.org/CSU**.
3. Complete the online FAFSA application for federal financial aid: FAFSA Website: **fafsa.ed.gov**. Central State University code: 003026.
4. Note: The U.S. Department of Education may require further verification. Any federal aid received must be used first.
5. If you are an eligible OCSEA bargaining unit State of Ohio employee, you must utilize your Union Education Trust (UET) funds **and you must apply for UET vouchers to attend**. You can call **1-800-969-4702, ext. 2645** or email **blowe@ocsea.org** to confirm your eligibility for UET. You are eligible for vouchers up to \$4,000 per fiscal year through the Career Improvement Program (CIP) to attend Central State University.
6. Submit official college transcripts (and high school/GED if less than associate degree) to:

Transcripts can be sent digitally from certain providers.
7. Depending on the program, additional steps may be required.

Please Note: Each of the items need to be completed, but you can work on each at the same time—you don't have to wait for a response to move on to the next item.
